## Leon Springs Business Association's mixer a success

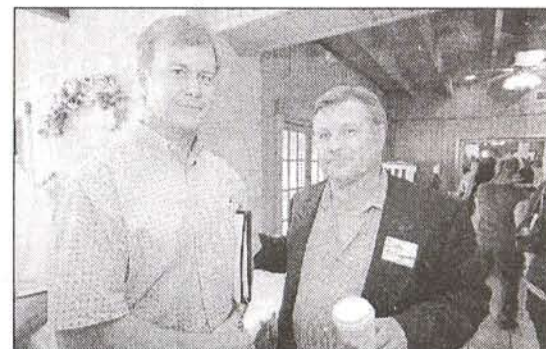
